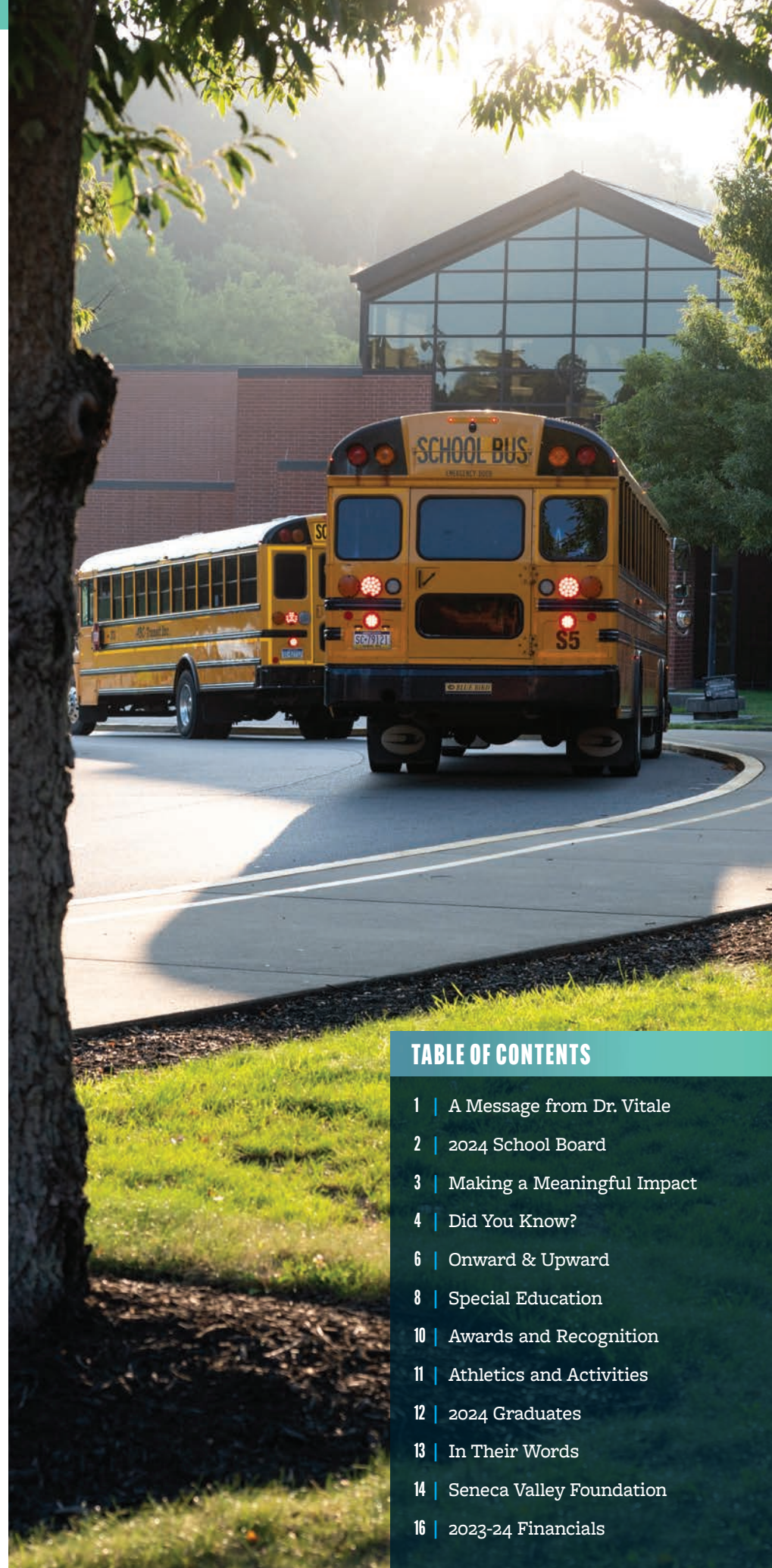

The Power of Positivity

Mr. Mike Manipole, a Health and Physical Education teacher at Ryan Gloyer Middle School (RGMS), received the Ann Moniot Outstanding Middle Level Teacher Award for 2023-24 school year by the Pennsylvania Association for Middle Level Education (PAMLE). Mr. Manipole was recognized for his exceptional contributions, inspiring enthusiasm for teaching and building strong, positive relationships with both students and colleagues.

A Symphony of Success

Inspiring Students One Note at a Time

Mrs. Tracy Glass received the 2024 Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) Citation of Excellence in Teaching Award for District 5, honoring her work as an instrumental instructor and director of elementary and middle school band ensembles—inspiring the District’s youngest musicians.

Recognized for her impactful work and instilling a passion for music in her students, Ms. Chessa Fernandez Crum, RGMS Choir Director, received the 2024 Butler County Symphony Association’s Outstanding Music Educator Award.

Music to Our Ears

The Seneca Valley School District was recognized by the National Association of Music Merchants (NAMM) Foundation with the prestigious designation of Best Communities for Music Education, in acknowledgment of its exceptional dedication to music education. This designation is awarded to districts that demonstrate outstanding achievement for providing music access and education to all students.



Championing Change

Recognized for building a more inclusive, engaged and equitable school community, Ms. Michele Russo, English teacher at Seneca Valley Intermediate High School, was selected as a recipient of the Antisemitism Civic Courage Award by the Shine A Light organization. This esteemed award honors students and educators who exemplify strong citizenship by taking action against antisemitism and combating hate in their communities.



National Designation

Receiving national recognition for achieving environmental excellence, Rowan Elementary School was awarded the designation of a Green Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education. Rowan was one of only three schools from Pennsylvania recognized, in addition to also being the only Pennsylvania elementary public school and the only educational institution representing the western side of the state.



Serving the Community

Seneca Valley School District received the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors (PSATS) Youth Award, a statewide honor recognizing students’ community service efforts. Throughout the year, hundreds of students partnered with Cranberry Township on various volunteer projects to enhance and beautify the area.



Honored in WPIAL Hall of Fame

Ms. Heather Lewis, SV Athletics and Activities Director, was inducted into the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League (WPIAL) Hall of Fame Class of 2024, under the Courage category. A breast cancer survivor, she fought bravely for 10 months in 2021-22. Ms. Lewis is also Seneca Valley’s first female Athletics and Activities Director and has served in this position since 2012.

Special Education

The Seneca Valley School District's Special Education Department is committed to meeting the needs of students with disabilities and helping them reach their potential. The Seneca Valley School District offers a continuum of services and placement options to meet the needs of each student.

- Speech and Language Support

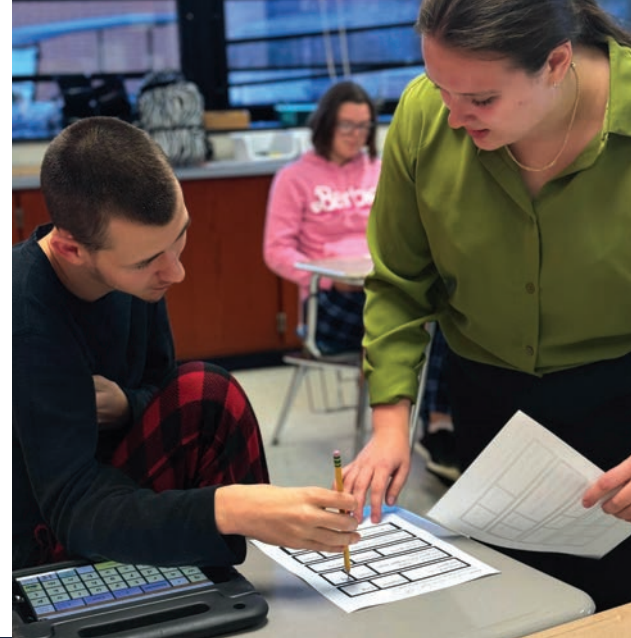
Services may be provided by special education teachers, classroom teachers, speech therapists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, school nurses, counselors, paraprofessional staff, and others with specialized training and expertise. Additionally, the District offers a robust Transition Program to support the development of vocational skills for students.

Gifted Education

The Seneca Valley Special Education Department is also committed to meeting the needs of gifted students by ensuring that they are served through a comprehensive program designed to develop their strengths and potential. At Seneca Valley, through the partnership of support staff and general education teachers, educational opportunities for an identified student include varied enrichment and acceleration options. Each student is viewed as an individual with specific strengths, aptitudes and interests which contribute to the development of customized gifted programming for students.



COMMUNITY-BASED VOCATIONAL TRAINING



The Community-Based Vocational Training (CBVT) program is designed to provide on-the-job training for individuals with exceptionalities to help them gain skills for integrated competitive employment in the student's home community. These students require the extra time and support offered to obtain vocational skills necessary for employment upon graduation.

CBVT Goals

- Offer students opportunities to acquire job skills in natural environments
- Provide vocational training in the business community with the support of a job coach and transition specialist
- Emphasize business standards regarding work quality, production, safety, work attire and appropriate work behaviors
- Require students to wear uniforms and call off when they will not be working
- Improve work rate, hard skills, soft skills and stamina

AWARDS & RECOGNITION



National Merit Winners

The National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC®) announced that Shivani Umesh (SV '24) was a National Merit \$2,500 Scholarship winner. Miss Umesh, one of 2,500 Merit Scholar designees, was chosen from a talent pool of more than 15,000 outstanding Finalists in the 2024 National Merit Scholarship Program.

Alexander Kim (SV '24) and Lucas Boyle (SV '24) were named semifinalists and then finalists in the 69th Annual National Merit Scholarship Program held by the NMSC. Additionally, Lydia Miller (SV '24) and Lihini Ranaweera (SV '24) were named Commended Students in the 2024 National Merit Scholarship Program.



Academic Excellence

Seneca Valley's Academic Decathlon team placed seventh in the nation and earned four individual national medals at the United States Academic Decathlon (USAD) National Competition that was held April 25-27, 2024.

Prior to competing at Nationals, the SV Academic Decathlon team placed first in the USAD State Competition, ultimately earning them a spot on the national stage to represent the Keystone State.

Carson Scholar

Yasmeeen Fahs, a sixth grader at Haine Middle School, was named a 2024 Carson Scholar, one of 570 students nationwide to receive this honor. She received a \$1,000 scholarship that will be invested for her college education and was recognized at the 20th annual Carson Scholars Fund's Pittsburgh Awards Banquet on April 7, 2024. Miss Fahs was selected for her outstanding academic achievement, integrity, and civic and social responsibility.

Soaring Success

Seneca Valley received the College Board AP® Computer Science Female Diversity Award for its high female representation in AP Computer Science Principles. This prestigious award recognizes schools that have achieved 50% or higher female representation among AP Computer Science exam takers, or a percentage of female exam takers that meets or exceeds the school's female population.

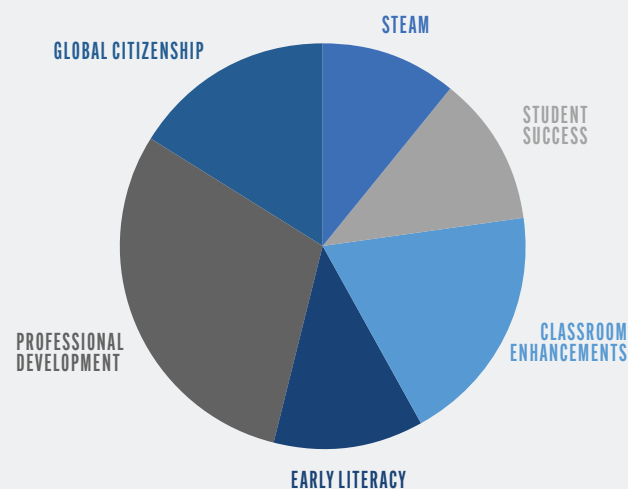

The Foundation achieves this by seeking donations and patrons to facilitate new District, building or classroom projects, programs and/or grants/scholarships. Its board members consist of stakeholders from local business leaders, community leaders and school leaders. As a non-profit organization, the SVF is utilized as a vehicle by which memorial and other charitable donations may be made to the Seneca Valley School District.

The SVF is committed to encouraging academic excellence and innovation throughout Seneca Valley Schools. With the incredible generosity of the Seneca Valley community and beyond throughout 2023-24, the SVF has proudly supported 49 initiatives throughout the District totaling over \$110,500. 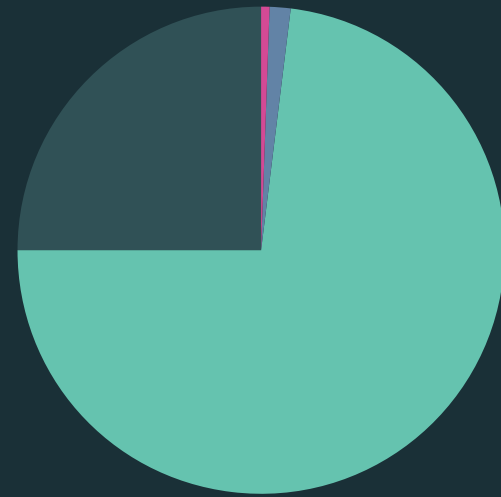

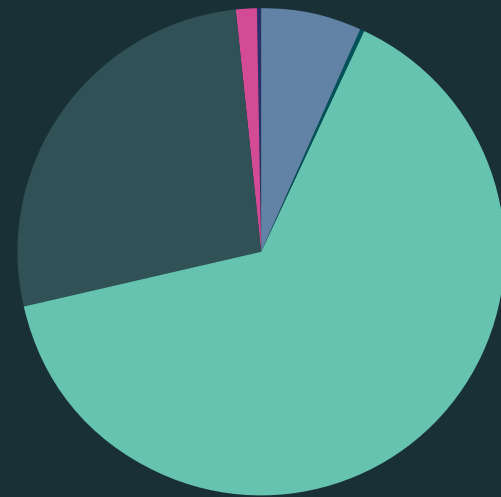

The primary sources of Local Revenue for Seneca Valley are real estate and earned income taxes. Also included in Local Revenue are federal funds that pass through our intermediate unit, as well as funds generated when Seneca Valley provides cyber services to outside school districts. We are cognizant of the significance—and take very seriously—the responsibility that comes with spending revenue from local sources.
